Woodcreek alderman dies at home

On the last day of March, Jim Fielder shot a 77 on the Woodcreek golf course, his best score ever.

Returning home, he told friends, "If I never shoot another game of golf, I've made it."

He never did shoot that other game. He had a pain in his leg and wanted to stay off his feet so he could play in a home and home tournament Friday in Austin, but Thursday he died.

Asked if that story would be an appropriate way to start a eulogy of him, his widow Eunice said, "He'd love it."

Memorial services were held Saturday, and Fielder's ashes were buried at the Capitol Crematory in Austin.

Fielder, one of Woodcreek's first aldermen, was born August 4, 1920, to a large, prominent family in Baytown. He grew up in Lockhart, where one of his brothers still lives.

Just before World War II, he was in the Army, part of the 124th Cavalry, one of the last horse cavalry units. Jim got out of the Army, but the next day Japan attacked

Pearl Harbor, and he got right back in. In the engineers, he spent World War II in North Africa and Hawaii.

During that time, part of his job was making models for invaders to study, and he recently used that skill to begin working on a model of Woodcreek. Made of plaster, it is about nine feet square and sits now

on a table in his study. It's almost complete — all the hills and roads are in but some houses remain to be glued down.

Mrs. Fielder said Monday night it is available if someone would like to put it on public display.

After World War II, Jim went to work for Humble Oil and Refining Co. as a machinist and retired as a supervisor.

He and Eunice had bought land in Woodcreek in 1978, and they moved here when he retired in 1981.

Here, Jim became one of the active people in the community. He was a director of the Lion's Club and president this year of the Woodcreek Men's Golf Association.

Last year, he sponsored a petition to get improvements on Ranch Road 12, and this year he was named to the Chamber of Commerce's traffic committee.

He also took care of the EMS ambulances and was always available for Woodcreek's cleanups and pothole filling.

"He was just a good person," said Jack Miller, mayor of Woodcreek.

In his personal life, Jim was jovial and happy. Mrs. Fielder said. He loved telling jokes and had a lot of old-fashioned sayings he used to describe situations.

The couple also liked to dance, but only big-band dancing. Once, at a Lion's Club dance, they won the Ginger Rogers-Fred Astaire Contest — even though they didn't know one was going on.

He liked dinner parties and then sitting around talking, Mrs. Fielder said.

"He thoroughly enjoyed life at the time he passed away," she said Monday.

In the end it may have been the pains in his legs that killed him, she said. He had had blood clots in his veins for about 25 years and was taking blood thinner. Mrs. Fielder thinks one of the clots got loose last week and went to his heart.
