Noted civic leader dies

SAN MARCOS -- Frank W. Zimmerman, a well known San

Marcos business and civic leader and a theatre owner here for many years, died Tuesday morning, April 16, in an Austin hospital.

Survivors include his wife, Mrs. Willie Zimmerman of San Marcos; two sons, Frank W. Zimmerman Jr. of Washington D.C., and Roger Zimmerman of San Marcos; brother, Joe Zimmerman of San Marcos; and five grandchildren.

Zimmerman came to San Marcos in 1922 and bought the two motion picture theatres in the town. He was ever a leader in local affairs, and the citizens recognized his service with a special "Frank Zimmerman Day" a little over a year ago.

Among the ways he contributed to the community were as mayor,

as scout master for five years, as American Legion commander, as Chamber of Commerce president, and as fund chairman for the San Marcos City Library.

During World War II, he held one of the nation's most successful war bond drives conducted in theatres across the country. He was also a charter member of the San Marcos Kiwanis Club and served as its president and secretary, as well as serving as Kiwanis lieutenant governor.

Shortly after his arrival in San Marcos, he became a member of the First Christian Church and was an active member of that church for the remainder of his life.

During the depression, Zimmerman was one of a group of businessmen who helped raise money to finance San Marcos Baptist Academy. He was also an important force in helping build the American Legion building across from City Park. It was during his tenure as mayor that land was purchased for City Park, and in that same tenure the San Marcos Police Department was begun to replace the marshal's office, and the sewage plant was removed from the San Marcos River Area.
